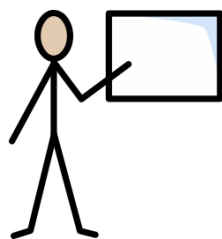
Our Head Teacher is Mr Stace.

I will be able to find out what I'm doing each day by looking at the timetable. The pictures will be the same and it will be next to the whiteboard.



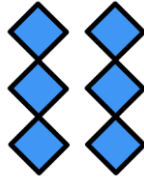
This is my classroom



I will enter through the outside door. This will also be where I leave for break time and at the end of the day.



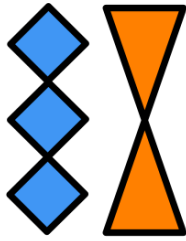

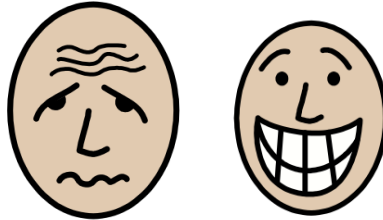

It is ok to ask questions.

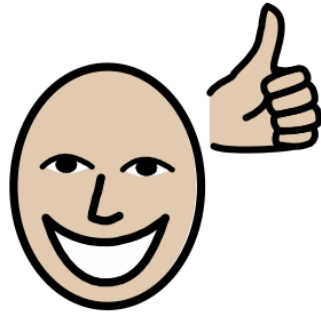


It is ok to not know what to do all the time.
